Consider Discussing:


- > The importance of monitoring bad cholesterol (LDL-C) and its link to cardiovascular events
- > Available treatment options to lower LDL-C below recommended levels

When Visiting Your HCP, You May Want To:

- > Ask questions if you don't understand something
- Discuss your goals for lowering your LDL-C & cardiovascular risk
- Talk openly about any concerns or preferences







Short-term Follow-up:

Monitor & adjust your treatment plan as needed with your doctor

- > Discuss with your doctor about whether your LDL-C levels are at the recommended threshold
- > It may be beneficial to ask about next cholesterol test (eg, every 4-12 weeks) & schedule next follow-up

Long-term Follow-up:

Chronic care

- > Along with your doctor, monitor your LDL-C levels to ensure that they are below the recommended threshold. If unmet, your doctor may refer you to a lipid specialist
- > It may be beneficial to ask about next cholesterol test (eg, annually or determined by the HCP)
